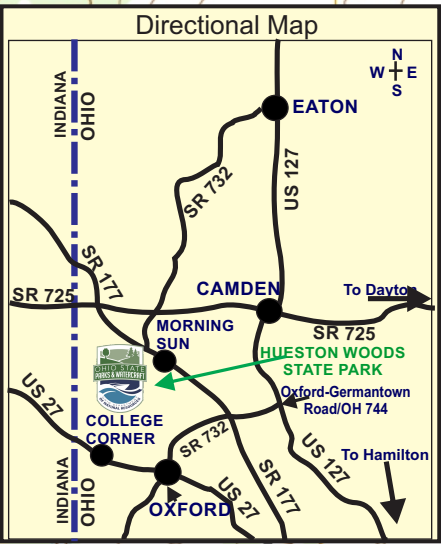
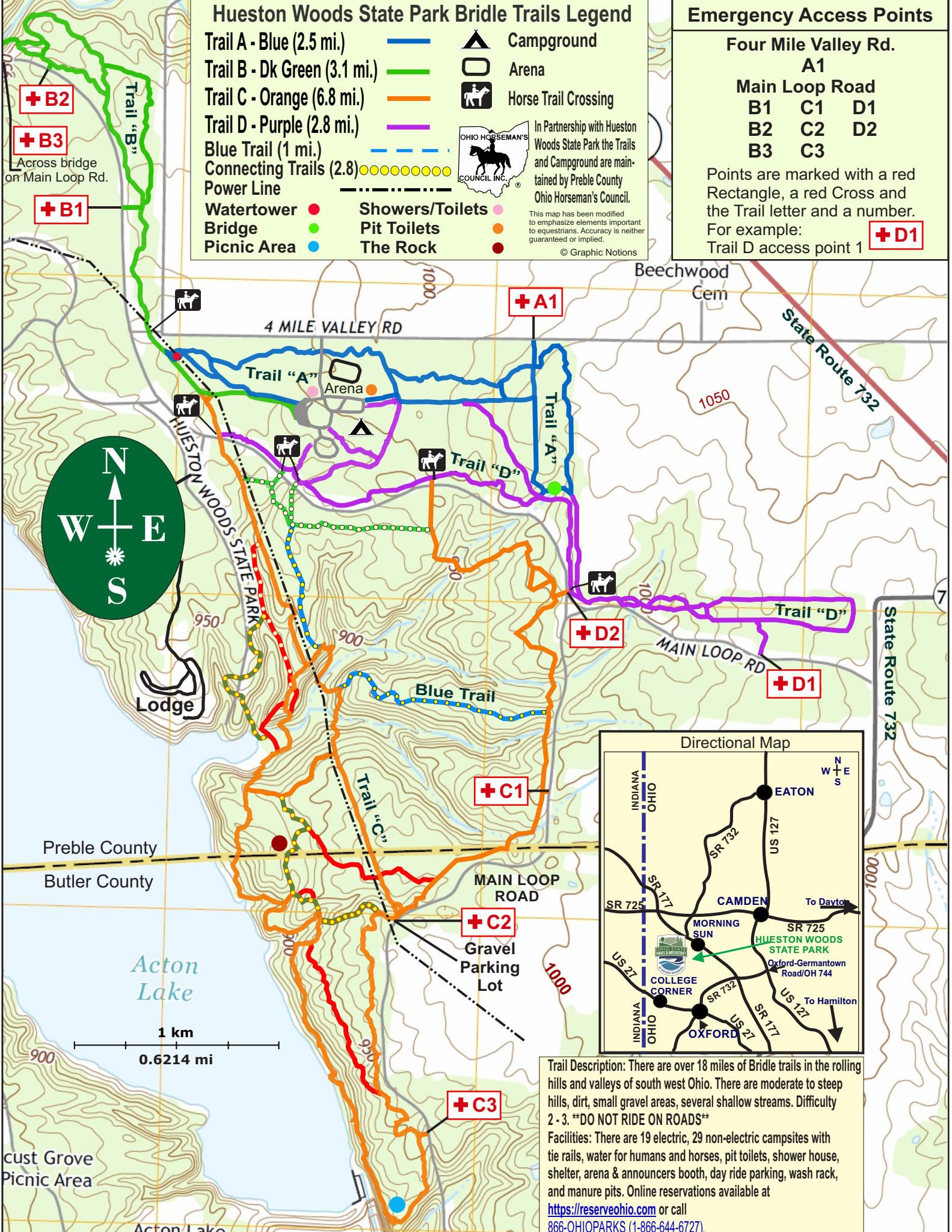

Trail Description: There are over 18 miles of Bridle trails in the rolling hills and valleys of south west Ohio. There are moderate to steep hills, dirt, small gravel areas, several shallow streams. Difficulty 2 - 3. ****DO NOT RIDE ON ROADS****

Facilities: There are 19 electric, 29 non-electric campsites with tie rails, water for humans and horses, pit toilets, shower house, shelter, arena & announcers booth, day ride parking, wash rack, and manure pits.
